1. Situation. There is a critical requirement to establish a formalized and streamlined process for planning and coordinating Deployments for Training (DFT) and other unit initiated training events throughout II Marine Expeditionary Force (II MEF). The absence of a formalized process to plan and coordinate unit initiated training events results in a lack of visibility across the II MEF staff that negatively impacts training support of subordinate units. A formalized process will enable II MEF staff to more efficiently coordinate support for DFTs and other unit initiated training events, minimize wasteful spending, and alleviate missed training opportunities for Major Subordinate Commands (MSCs) and Major Subordinate Elements (MSEs). For the purposes of this Order, a DFT is a unit initiated training event conducted at locations other than home station. If the unit initiated training event will require support from outside the parent MSC/MSE, regardless of location, the event requires an intentions message to be submitted by the supported unit.

2. Mission. This Order provides specific guidance and instructions governing staff planning and coordination for unit directed training events at II MEF.

3. Execution

a. Commander's Intent. The intent of this Order is to ensure common understanding within II MEF when addressing DFT and unit initiated training event planning and coordination. DFTs are an important aspect of II MEF's annual training plan. The current fiscally constrained environment calls for more detailed planning and resource management at all levels. To this end, it is imperative that we make the most of training by optimizing resource management and proper planning. To enable mission success, commanders are to thoroughly review and approve all unit initiated training requests and inform the II MEF Commanding General (CG) of support requirements in a timely manner. The desired end state is that by adhering to this Order, our unit commanders get the support they need to conduct DFTs and unit initiated training events.

b. Concept of Operations

(1) All II MEF units will submit a formal intentions message, via Automated Message Handling System (AMHS), to CG II MEF (ATTN: G3), no later than 120 days prior to training day one (T1-120) for all DFTs and unit initiated training. The intentions message will state whether or not the training event was identified in the annual Training, Exercise, and Employment Plan (TEEP) budget message, per reference (a). If not included in the TEEP budget message, then the training event must be included in the next update to the TEEP budget message.

(2) The intentions message will include participating units, location, dates, external support requirements, estimated cost, and a commander's assessment. The commander's assessment will clearly state Mission Essential Tasks to be accomplished, the projected effect on unit readiness, a justification for off-site training and risk to long range training plan if not conducted. All intentions messages received by CG II MEF must be endorsed by the appropriate MSC CG or MSE CO. Enclosure (1) is a sample format of an intentions message.

c. Tasks

(1) II MEF G-1. Support MSC/MSEs planning efforts and coordinate necessary staff actions internal to and external of II MEF.

(2) II MEF G-3

(a) Receive and staff all intentions messages from subordinate units. Coordinate staff actions in accordance with this Order.

(b) Release a Feasibility of Support (FOS) message by (T1-110) for support requests identified in the intentions message and during staffing.

(c) No later than (T1-75), II MEF G-3 will publish a message that tasks subordinate units to support the training event, as required. This message will be authorization to deploy to conduct training as described in the intentions message.

(3) II MEF G-4. Support MSC/MSEs planning efforts and coordinate necessary staff actions internal to and external of II MEF.

(4) II MEF G-7. Support MSC/MSEs planning efforts and coordinate necessary staff actions internal to and external of II MEF.

(5) II MEF G-8. Support MSC/MSEs planning efforts and coordinate necessary staff actions internal to and external of II MEF.

(6) Expeditionary Operations Training Group. Support MSC/MSEs planning efforts and coordinate necessary staff actions internal to and external of II MEF.

(7) II MEF MSCs and MSEs

(a) Submit an intentions message, via AMHS, to the CG II MEF no later than T1-120 for all DFTs and unit initiated training events as described in paragraph 1 of this Order.

(b) Submit FOS responses to the appropriate MEF staff directorate (e.g., G-1, G-3, G-4, G-7, G-8) at a minimum no later than (T1-80). Negative FOS responses must include clearly defined justification and risk if forced to source.

(c) Deploying units shall submit a Concept of Operations to the CG II MEF (ATTN: G-3) no later than (T1-60). Confirmation and After Action briefs will be scheduled in accordance with reference (b).

(d) Training opportunities may develop outside of the business rules outlined in this Order. During such circumstances, MSCs/MSEs will publish an intentions message at the earliest possible date. The intentions message must contain all the information as described in paragraph 3b(2) of this Order.

(e) Commanding General, 2d Marine Aircraft Wing. DFTs for flying squadrons are defined as any training event that requires the deployment of any capability in addition to flight crew and aircraft and that is not an extended training flight as defined within paragraph 1402.1 of reference (c).

d. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Units conducting DFTs will adhere to Force Deployment Planning and Execution timelines published in reference (d).

(2) Units will use the Cost to Run a MEF data file as the basis of intentions messages. This file captures the majority of required data to effectively coordinate support for the DFT. Cost to Run a MEF data file is located at <https://eis.usmc.mil/sites/iimefcompt/MRA/SitePages/Home.aspx>. Request access to this site per reference (e).

(3) DFT funding not captured in the published TEEP budget message must be clearly identified in the intentions message.


(4) Units will capture all costs associated with the training event per reference (f).

4. Administration and Logistics. Submit recommended changes concerning the contents of this Order via the chain of command to II MEF Assistant Chief of Staff G-3.

5. Command and Signal

a. Command. This Order is applicable to II MEF and its subordinate units.

b. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed.

Subj: Intentions Message Format

1. A DFT intentions message should convey as much information as is known about the deployment to allow visibility and coordination.

2. A DFT intentions message will be relayed via AMHS.

3. At a minimum, the intentions message will include:

a. Participating units (Reference point 1).

b. Location (Reference point 2).

c. Dates (Reference point 3).

d. External support requirements (Reference point 4).

e. Estimated cost (Reference point 5).

f. Commander's assessment that addresses the following:

(1) Mission Essential Tasks to be accomplished (Reference point 6).

(2) Projected effect of DFT on unit readiness (Reference point 7).

(3) A justification for off-site training (Reference point 8).

(4) Risk to long range training plan if not conducted. (Reference point 9).

g. Endorsement by the appropriate MSC CG or MSE CO (Reference point 10).

3.A. COMMANDER'S INTENT

3.A.1. PURPOSE. FOCUS ON LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT, UNIT DISCIPLINE AND IMPROVING UNIT COHESION AND ESPRIT DE CORPS THROUGH SHARED HARDSHIP AND CHALLENGES, WHILE IMPROVING THE BATTALIONS ABILITY TO SHOOT, MOVE, AND COMMUNICATE IN ANY CLIMB OR PLACE.

3.A.2. METHOD. READY BATTALION STAFF AND COMPANY HEADQUARTERS MASTER BASICS OF LOGISTICAL AND OPERATIONAL PLANNING CYCLES AND REPORTING/C2 OF LIVE OPERATIONS IN COMPLEX, MOUNTAINOUS TERRAIN. 4.B.7.A. FUNDING REQUEST TO BE SUBMITTED VIA SEPCOR. THE FOLLOWING ESTIMATE IS PROVIDED FOR PLANNING PURPOSES, AND IS BASED ON PROJECTED ON-HAND STRENGTH, INCLUDING REQUESTED ATTACHMENTS FOR THE EXERCISE. IF THE BATTALION RECEIVES ADD PERS, THE COSTS FOR CHOW AND TOP WILL CORRESPONDINGLY INCREASE.
